## Opportunity Mental Health Program – Geriatric Psychiatry seeking a Geriatric Psychiatrist Full-time Permanent Faculty Position

The Ottawa Hospital (TOH) Mental Health program is a Schedule 1 Facility under the Mental Health Act, which operates the following general psychiatry acute care programs and services at two campuses (Civic and General):

- Psychiatric Emergency Services
- Inpatient Service
- Outpatient Clinics (including Urgent Consult Clinic)
- Acute Partial Hospitalization
- Consultation Programs & Medical/Surgical Liaison Service

The Ottawa Hospital also provides specialized programs and/or services:

- Mobile Crisis Team & Community Crisis Stabilization Beds
- Champlain District First Episode Psychosis Program (regional program)
- Perinatal Mental Health Services
- Regional Program for the Treatment of Eating Disorder
- Community Treatment Order Coordinator

We currently have an opening for a geriatric psychiatrist working as part of an interdisciplinary consultation team for medical inpatients or as a most responsible physician for psychiatric inpatients or some combination thereof. This academic position would be 0.6 FTE clinical and 0.4 FTE of research and career development time.

Job duties:

- Provide care to older adults 3 days per week clinical split between outpatient psychiatry our Behavioural Supports Ontario (BSO) team with 2 days pers week research and career development time.
- Serve as a liaison psychiatrist to the Ottawa Hospital Cystic Fibrosis Clinic.
- Consults with other health care providers to devise a plan to manage other health issues or medications that may be impacting the patient's mental status.
- Develops and implements treatment plans, including prescription of medications.
- Monitors and evaluates treatment results.
- Evaluates patients by interviewing patient, family, and other persons; observing behaviors; reviewing medical history and related documents; selecting, administering, and interpreting psychological tests; and ordering laboratory tests and evaluating results.
- Maintains historical records by documenting symptoms, medications, and treatment events and writing summaries.
- Updates job knowledge by participating in continuing medical educational opportunities, reading professional publications, maintaining personal networks, participating in professional organizations, and be actively involved in education quality improvement projects.

Required Education, Knowledge, Experience and Skills:

- Expertise in and commitment to treatment of patients in a fast-paced acute general psychiatry academic setting.
- Demonstrated experience as a Geriatric Psychiatrist in a multidisciplinary team in the management of geriatric inpatients, rehabilitation centres, long-term care homes, and outpatient clinical settings.
- Eligible for licensure by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.
- Holds or eligible for FRCPC designation in psychiatry.
- Meet criteria to apply for and receive appropriate medical staff privileges at The Ottawa Hospital.
- Meet criteria and receive an academic appointment at the University of Ottawa, Faculty of Medicine at the rank of Assistant Professor or higher.
- Demonstrated experience in assessing the patient's needs.
- Demonstrated experience in participating as an active member of the health care team.
- Demonstrated experience in communicating effectively in an oral and written format with patients, public, colleagues and other health discipline.
- Identifies an interest in research on the impact of psychotropic medications on cognition.
- Holds a post graduate diploma in epidemiology
- Participate annually in the Canadian Academy of Geriatric Psychiatry.
- Ability to communicate in a bilingual environment (French & English) is preferred.

Wage range: \$250,000 - \$400,000

Benefits: Successful applicants will work in a hospital privileges model. Remuneration is fee for service with alternate funding plan for academic work.
